USCIS ANNOUNCES NEW FILING PROCEDURES

USCIS recently made changes to its filing procedures for adoption-based application approvals (Forms I-600A, I-600, I-800A, I-800). A new lockbox facility has been established in Lewisville, Texas for the filing of I-600A & I-600 Forms. The address for filing I-800A & I-800 Forms has also been changed to a new lockbox also in Lewisville Texas. The two lockboxes in Lewisville are different for Hague vs. non-Hague cases.

In some international adoptions, the filing of the immigration forms may involve more than just one initial application. The lockbox facility is used for some, but not all, filings.

USCIS has published instructions for the filing of forms and has issued a public announcement; and both are available on the USCIS web site at www.uscis.gov under the topics of "adoption" and/or "forms".
